Children collected lots of leaves and they used them for learning about sizes, shapes and to create their own leaf creatures.




Reception have been working hard to




# Year 4 News

# Year 5 News



The children learned a great deal about how to stay safe, understand risks and avoid accidents by experiencing realistic, interactive learning.




### **SCIENCE**
